

The new bus concession at a glance



- From 1st April 2008, if you live in England and you're 60 or over, or eligible disabled, you'll be able to enjoy free off-peak local bus travel (that's 9.30am until 11pm Monday – Friday, and all day weekends and bank holidays) on local buses anywhere in England.
- So even when visiting friends or enjoying a holiday anywhere in England, the same pass will enable free off-peak bus travel there too.
- England's concession applies just to local off-peak bus travel. Some authorities choose to fund additional benefits to their residents, e.g. train, tram or peak time bus travel. As a general rule, these additional benefits will only be available to local residents – but passengers should check with their local authority to find out exactly what services are covered in their area. Re-stickered London Freedom passes ARE valid for the national concession.
