Waste Export Controls

➔ Set out in EU Regulations

➔ Two levels of control:

➔ Prior Notification and consent – we know about these

➔ Green List Controls – we're not told about these

➔ Some waste exports are prohibited – we're not told about these!

➔ “Illegal Waste Shipments”

➔ Offences

➔ Repatriation

Recycling / Reuse – Markets?

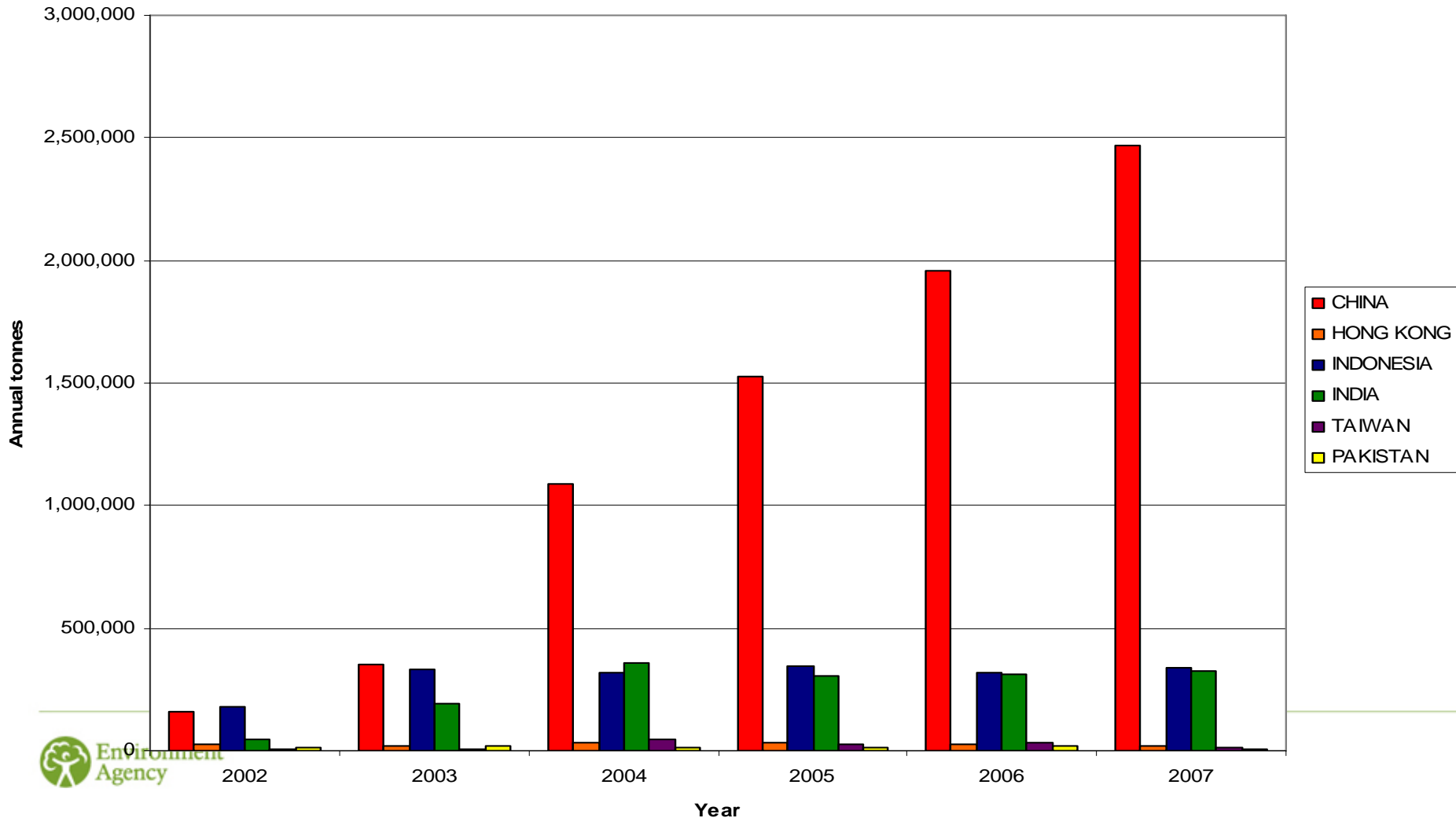


➔ Waste exports

- ➔ 2002 – circa 7 million tonnes
- ➔ 2008 – circa 14 million tonnes
- ➔ Green List / Notified



Paper – key non EU destinations



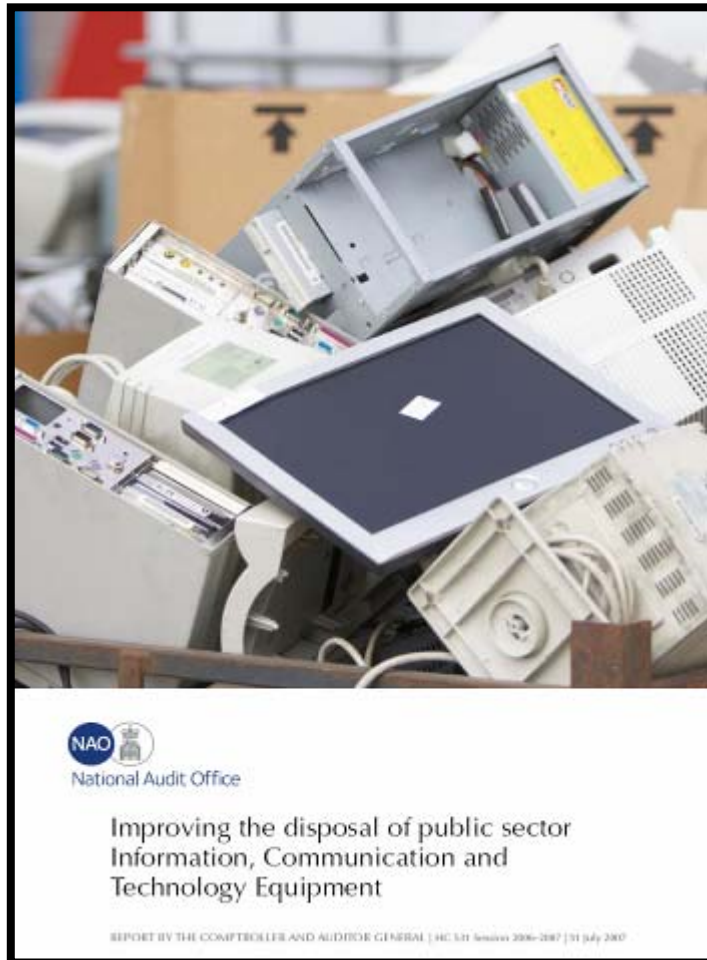
Household recyclables

- ➔ Duty of Care
- ➔ Green List / Not Green List
- ➔ Waste/Second hand goods

➔ Notices

- ➔ Stop Notices – served on person in control
- ➔ Information Notices
