The guidelines aim to inform teachers on the benefits of bicycle helmets as part of any school policy of cycling to and from school. The document provides information that will allow teachers to fully understand the benefit of helmets and how they are effective in reducing head injury.	Â£8,743.00
Brake	Head restraints and keeping your distance promotional materials. The project produced 200,000 copies of two leaflets, one showing how to correctly adjust head restraints and the other reminding drivers of the importance of keeping their distance. 5,000 copies of each leaflet was also reproduced in poster form.
