

APPLICATION FOR AN OPERATING PERMIT BY FOREIGN REGISTERED AIRCRAFT FLYING TRAINING

Before making an application, the applicant should refer to the requirements for using foreign registered aircraft for flying training in the UK. Applications should be made at least 30 days before flying training is due to take place.
