

CAP 642 airside safety management audit (vehicle operations and maintenance)



Who should attend

The audit is carried out in conjunction with the Airside Operations Manager (or equivalent). Specific training may be offered to operators, vehicle maintenance contractors or drivers dependent on the airport's needs.

Benefits

As the government authority on vehicle inspection, standards and procedures, VOSA are able to offer an expert, independent view on the airport's compliance with CAP 642 guidelines and offer suggestions for continuous improvement as well as training for operators who may need assistance to bring their standards up to the required level.

10 Day audit content

The audit and any training required are tailored to each customer's individual requirements. Because CAP 642 provides guidelines rather than regulations, specific requirements will vary from airport to airport so a familiarisation meeting may be necessary prior to the audit.

VOSA will carry out an independent audit of vehicle maintenance operations and systems to ensure that vehicles which are operated airside comply with the CAP 642 best practice guidelines. Specifically, the audit will look at vehicle maintenance, contractors, records inspection and inspection standards.

During the audit, operators will be given guidance and advice as appropriate to assist them in achieving the airport's required standards. Following the audit, a report of current standards
